Dear Mr. Husher,

I am sorry for the delay in replying to your letter, which we received on September 25th.

I regret that it is not possible to give you the information you have asked for mithout first communicating with Ottawa, but I send you herewith the following information in respect of various persons who were charged in the esplonage this, according to the records of the Canadian Department of Justice:

- Ban Carr. Warrant issued for his arrest but he has not been located.
- Fred Rose. He was convicted before Mr. Justice Lazura and jury on the 20th June, 1946, and sentenced to six years in the peritentiary. His appeal was dismissed.
- David Gordon Lunan. He was convicted by Mrl Justice McRuer and jury on the 18th November, 1946, and sentenced to five years in the penitentiary. His appeal was dismissed.
- Philip Durnford Pemberton Smith. He was convicted by Judge MacDougall on the 27th December, 1946, and sentenced to five years in the penitentiary. His appeal was dismissed.
- Edward Wilfred Meserall. He was convicted by Mr. Justice McRuer and jury on the 22nd May, 1946, and sentenced to four years in the penitentiary. His appeal was dismissed.
- Israel Halperin. He was acquitted on March 24th, 1947, by Judge MacDougall.
- Frederick Poland. He was acquitted on January 16, 1947, by Judge MacDougall.
- Eric Adams. He was acquitted on the 22nd October, 1946, by Mr. Justice McRuer and jury.
- Kathleen Willsher. She pleaded guilty and was found guilty on the 3rd May, 1946, by Judge MacDougall and sentenced to three years in the penitentiary.

- Matt Simons Nightingale. He was acquitted on the 7th November, 1946, by Mr. Justice McFarlane and jury.
- Pavid Shugar. He was acquitted on the 7th December, 1946, by Judge MacDougall.
- Harold Samuel Gerson. He was convicted by Wr. Justice McFarlane and jury on the lith October, 1946, and sentenced to five years in the penitentiary. An appeal was allowed on a technical ground and he is now awaiting retrial.
- Semuel Saul Burmen. No charge laid.
- Raymond Boyer. He was tried and discharged on disagreement of jury before Mr. Justice Lazure. He is now awaiting retrial.
- James Scott Benning. He was convicted on the 29th October, 1946, by Mr.

 Justice McRuer and jury and sentenced to five years in the
 penitentiary. His appeal was dismissed.
- Agetha Chapman. She was acquitted on the 27th November, 1946, by Judge Mac-Dougall.
- Freds Linton. A warrant was issued for her arrest butanot found.
- Emma Wolkin. She pleaded guilty and was found guilty on the 10th April, 1946, and sentenced to two years and six months in the penitentiary by Judge MacDougall.
- John Sobologg. He pleaded guilty and was found guilty by Magistrate Bigelow of Toronto and fined \$500 and costs.
- Henry Harris. He was acquitted by Judge MacDougall on January 27th, 1947.
- W. M. Pappin. He was acquitted by Judge MacDougall on October 17th, 1946.
