

It has come to our attention that Mrs Henry LECA.H, formerly of Toronto, Ontario, is now believed to be sesiding in London, England, but we are unable to obtain the exact address.

- 2. In case this woman comes to your attention, we thought you might like to know that in 1944 she visited with Sam CARR who as you know was convicted during the espionage trials of 1946. The husband Henry LECASH was evidently a business associate of Ike M. ELLENSON in their enterprise, The downercial Plastics Products Company Limited, Toronto, Ontario. ELLENSON is an associate of Raymond BOYER, also convicted during the espionage frials of 1946 and now attends secret meetings of the Party in Montreal.
- 3. It should be emphasized that this information came to us through delicate sources.

In September 1945, Igor Gouzenko, cipher clerk to the Soviet military attaché in Ottawa, broke with the Reds and revealed the existence of a "network of undercover agents" in Canada working "under direct instructions from Moscow."

Acting on Gouzenko's information, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police rounded up government officials, scientists, engineers, a former captain in the Canadian Army, and the first Communist member of Parliament. Eighteen of them were tried and ten convicted. One suspect slipped out of the RCMP bag: Sam Carry né Schmil Kogan, described as a "recruiting agent" for the ring.

In January 1949, FBI agents discovered Carr living quietly with his wife in a New York apartment. In April he was convicted of conspiracy and sentenced to

six years in prison.

All the other convicted conspirators have served their terms. Last week, after 4 years 7 months 13 days, Carr, the last of the lot, was released from Kingston penitentiary. He told Canada, defiantly: "I am still a Communist."

B. The Ottawa-Toronto Group.

Sam CARR ("Sam"), Organising Secretary of the Canadian Communist Party, was recruited by Koudriavtzev in October 1942, and was put in charge of the Ottawa-Toronto group. This itself seems to have been divided into two parts since CARR himself resides in Toronto. Djevenov, the Tass man in Ottawa, using the cover name "Martin", was made the contact-man for the two agents in Ottawa, as follows:-

(1) J. Scott Benning ("Foster"), working in the Ministry of Munitions and Supply

(2) Eric Adams ("Ernst"), of the Foreign Exchange Control Board.

Under CAFR's more direct control and working in Toronto were:- ...

- (1) "Polland" (real name not known), working in the Intelligence Branch of the Air Force.
- (2) "Surejel" or "Surensel" (real name not known), who was working in the

It is possible that these two men did not knwo they were working for Soviet Intelligence, but believed they were acting only on behalf of the Communist Party. These ceased work in April 1943.

Among miscellaneous papers on the person of Sam CARR at the time of his arrest in New York on January 27th. last was one on which was written "P52753 VZ24". The F.B.I. think it very possible that this may refer to a passport and visa number used for his entry into the United States. however, they have been unable to identify such a travel document, and would like to know whether you think such a number could refer to a British passport.

In his letter SF.205/Caribbean Area/7/PA/DG of March 8th, 1949, Mr. Serpell mentioned your interest in a post-card sent by CARR to his wife, which was intercepted in New York in March, 1947. There were some indications in CARR's message that he was writing from a warm climate and, in view of previous reports, it was thought possible that he might be in the Caribbean. There is, however, nothing more than this to go on.

CARR's case comes up for trial on April 4th. The F.B.I. are sending an agent to give evidence that he followed a man in the United States who is identical with the photograph on the passport. It is also hoped, but not finally decided, that Mendel Morton KHIEGER, who was mentioned in my letter W.661 of June 9th, 1948 to B.2.a, will also give evidence that the false WITCZAK recruited A full personality note on KRIEGER has been prepared by the Bureau and should be available in the immediate future.

I arrived in Ottawa during my recent visit to Canada on the same day as Sam CARR. The Canadian capital and especially the R.C.M.P. was naturally agog, and I was able to discuss the case in some detail. I have also had a talk with the F.B.I. officer concerned since my return here.

CARR is in good health, and so far has refused to say anything of any interest. He is being charged on one count only, namely, of conspiring to forge a Canadian passport. The R.C.M.P. believe they have a cast-iron case on this charge, the maximum penalty for which is seven years' imprisonment. However, it is thought that if the Prosecution succeeds, the most he is likely to get is five years. It is not yet known what line CARR will take, but he has already had a discussion with a woman lawyer named GOLDSTICK, who is a Communist and who may well have given him instructions from the Party. He has also answered a series of general questions smuggled in to him by a journalist, and in one of his replies claims to be a loyal follower of Marx-Leninism. It is not thought that he will talk about his activities during the past three years, but there is a very slight possibility that he may be more co-operative if he thinks this will lead to a reduced prison sentence. Apparently he dislikes being in prison intensely.

The R.C.M.P. cannot of course produce the real WITCZAK, who is now in Poland, but they have the necessary documentar proof that he was not identical with the man chased across the United States by the F.B.I. They are also hoping that

the F.B.I. will allow one of its agents to testify about the pseudo-WITCZAK, but it is not at all certain that the Bureau will agree to this, as they are naturally rather touchy about that particular case.

There is no doubt that CARR made his way at least to France while in hiding. The proof of this is as follows (I discovered this very unofficially, so please do not quote me):- The Bureau intercepted a telephone conversation between FIELD and someone in Paris who they suspected was CARR. A record of this conversation was kept. A week or two ago, they intercepted another conversation between FIELD and an unknown man in New York whose telephone number they knew. A recording of this conversation was also made. Twelve F.B.I. agents were then invited, separately, to listen to both records and all decided that the unknown man in each case was identical. Surveillance was then put on the house of the New York telephone number, and CARR was duly found. It is therefore certain, although it cannot be proved in Court, that CARR was the man who telephoned FIELD from Paris. I think you will agree that this was a very clever piece of investigation.

Igor Gouzenko, former cipher clerk at the Russian Embassy here, gave evidence at today's hearing. He said that Carr asked for \$5,000 (£1,250) in 1945 to procure a forged passport for a Russian agent in the United States. After Moscow intelligence headquarters had wired that the sum was "fantastic" had wired that the sum was "fantastic," \$3,000 (£750) was agreed on.—Reuter.

SAM CARR ARRESTED IN CANADA

FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT

OTTAWA, Feb. 11

Sam Carr and his wife were taken into custody by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police at Prescott, Ontario, this morning. They were brought to Canada from New York under deportation proceedings.

Carr left Canada in 1946 at the time when investigations were being made by a Royal Commission into the circumstances surrounding the communication by public officials and others of confidential information to Russian agents. He was arrested in New York on January 27 by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Mr. Garson, Minister of Justice, said in the House of Commons to-night that Carr would be charged with conspiracy to commit forgery.

Please refer to my telegram RT/244 of January 27th, 1949.

Thanks to many months' painstaking investigation, Sam CARR was arrested by the F.B.I. for illegal entry on January 27th. His wife was arrested the following day for having over-stayed the time allowed by her entry permit. Both have refused to answer any questions and are unlikely to give any information to either the Federal Grand Jury or the House Un-American Activities Committee, both of which sub-poena'd them. The Bureau are searching all their effects for some indication of CARR's movements while in hiding and looking in particular for a passport which might show whether he was ever in Europe during that period.

The following remarks on American and Canadian reaction are strictly for your own information. The F.B.I. are delighted at the timing of the arrest, as the Director has to go to Congress for his budget on Monday and something dramatic like this always makes a good impression.

The R.C.M.P. are equally delighted at the prospect of getting their hands on CARR. Other people in Ottawa, however, are not so pleased. It is an election year and Parliament was opened the day before CARR's arrest. It appears that at some time in the past the Liberal Party, which is now in power, had a flirtation with the Labour Progressive Party. This was all very well at the time,

but it would not redound to the credit of the Liberals at the next election. CARR knows all about this and it is possible he will mention it if he is given a public trial. The situation in short is very like that in the recent U.S. elections, when the Republicans tried to capitalise on the relations of certain New-Dealers with known fellow-travellers.

- Mr. Sam Carr, who was mentioned in the Royal Commission's report in 1946, was arrested by the F.B.I. in New York on 27th January.
- 2. In answer to a question in the House of Commons on 28th January, Mr. Garson, the Minister of Justice, said that he did not know whether the United States authorities would institute deportation proceedings, but added that, if not, the Canadian authorities themselves would take extradition proceedings on the charges outstanding against Carr, namely conspiracy under the Official Secrets Act, the giving of false information to get a passport, and forging an application for a passport.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation announced here to-day that they had arrested Sam Carr, "the key figure in the Soviet spying case in Canada." Officials expect that he will be sent back to Canada to face trial under the Official Secrets Act.
Carr was named by the Canadian

Carr was named by the Canadian Royal Commission on Espionage in 1946 as one of two ringleaders of Russian spies in that country. The other was Fred Rose, a former member of Parliament, who is now serving a six-year sentence in prison for

breaches of the Official Secrets Act.

Canadian police were unable to arrest Carr as he left the country three years ago before a warrant could be served. Only one person connected with the spy trials is now sought. She is Freda Linton, a former secretary in Canadian Government could be served. ment employ, who also left the country before a warrant could be served and who is believed to have come to the United States.

SECRETS CHARGE

It is learned here that Sam Carr, who has been arrested in the United States, will stand trial on his return here on charges of conspiracy and of having communicated official secrets to agents of a foreign Power. He is described as a trained Russian agent who had attended the Lenin School in Moscow. He was born in Russia and became a naturalised Canadian in 1945.

Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation said this afternoon that Sam Carr, alleged to have been one of the leaders of a Russian spy ring in Canada, who was arrested in New York, would be turned over to the immigration service and held at Ellis Island to await the outcome of proceedings for deporting him to Canada. They said that his real name was Schmil Kogan, that he was born in Russia, and that he had entered Canada in 1925 and helped to organize the Young Communist League. When he rented an apartment a fortnight ago near Central Park he said he was Jack Lewis, an engineer from Boston, who had come here to get material for a book.

OTTAWA, JAN. 27

Mr. Garson, Minister of Justice, reported to-night that extradition proceedings will be instituted to bring Carr from the United States. It is understood that the charges which Carr will be called upon to answer arise from the findings of the Royal Commission which in 1946 was investigating the facts and circumstances surrounding the communication by public officials and others of confidential information to the agents of a foreign Power.

This opinion is derived from the examination of communications passing from Julia CARR in Toronto to LAube TZERKO FF. 73425 and Philip Morton FIELD in New York. These communications pass through the hands of Raymond WECHSLER, who runs a Communist Party Summer School at Madison, Connecticut, and they recently permitted the inference that Julia hoped to see CARR at the beginning of this month.

The R.C.M.P. have reported that Julia CARR disappeared on July 29th, and it is thought that she may attempt to make contact in New York. This may, of course, be yet another false trail, but we shall inform you if we hear that the Americans have picked up any traces of Sam CARR.

We have no other reference on record of Raymond WECHSLER, The other names will all be well known to you.







SAM CARR's name figured prominently in the hearings of the Royal Commission in Canada on Soviet activities, CARR having been mentioned by IGOR GUZENKO as being a recruiter for the Soviet espionage system operating in Canada. CARR disappeared during the inquiry of the Royal Commission in Canada and his whereabouts have since been unknown to the authorities.

SAM CARR, during a visit to New York City in February 1946, contacted the following individuals: WILLIAM WEINER of the New Century Publishers; JOHN WILLIAMSON of Communist Party headquarters, and PHILIP M. FIELD, and AUBE TZERKO, both of the latter being subjects of an extensive investigation in New York City and believed to be in some way connected with the Soviet espionage case in Canada.

The Dies Committee in September 1939 produced evidence indicating that the CP, USA had made twelve one thousand dollar payments to SAM CARR, one of these having been signed by WILLIAM WEINER. These checks were cashed in a Montreal bank by CARR.

A confidential source advises that CARR was ousted from the Labor Progressive Party on April 20, 1946 because the party refused to countenance his delay in answering a subpoena issued for him in connection with the Government's investigation of spy activities in Canada.
