B) ANALYST

1. ROLE

The analyst's role is to specify and define the threat that regional, national, and international conflicts could constitute for the security of the Olympic Games. Also included in this role, are the recommendations of new avenues of exploration to the Coordinator of research-analysis.

2. TASKS

- Receive from the research-assistant all the pertinent data on the situations of conflict throughout the world, analyse same and draw conclusions.
- Report to the research-analysis coordinator the conclusions of his findings and emphasize the elements that would interest the activities of the Security Service or its other "subscribers".
- Notify the research-assistant of his requirements of information.

- Prepare according to request, situation briefs.
- Undertake a program of consultation with specialists in matters of politics, economics, cultural and social affairs.
- Sit on the study-group.
- Define in collaboration with the planning staff the steps and project-method of research-analysis.
- Check the results obtained from previous requests with the assistance of the planning staff.
- Take part in the preparation of mock operations.

3. QUALIFICATION

- M.A. (social sciences) or masters study program (political science, sociology, economics, geography, political and international relations).
- Experience in research-analysis.
- Experience in security or intelligence service desirable.
- Good knowledge of methodology.
- Mastery of French, working knowledge of English.
