Deployment of establishment

Security Service officer's level

1. The Commanding Officer "C" Division has recently ordered the preparation of a manpower plan for the Olympic period that would assure that key positions are manned around the clock by officers or officer candidates. The Commanding Officer has, for instance, indicated his wish to have Security Service commissioned officers in the position of liaison officer in the CIB Coordinating Center.

- 2. In the CO's view, officers should not be subject to excessive working hours and stress. He has therefore ordered that planning aim at 8-hour days/40-hour week, well-knowing that conditions will force an extension to these hours and that in fact an 8-hour day may at best be a ten or a 12-hour day.
- Were we to plan on the above guidelines, "C" Division Security Service would require 64 officers to fill all those positions considered to be critical to efficient and effective operations. (Sixteen positions are identified in our organizational structure as requiring an officer, from which, if we consider that it will be necessary to function 24 hours a day, 7 days a week the number 64 is arrived at.) The Security and Intelligence Services Joint Command Center requires 9 additional officers to meet identified commitments, bring us to a total requirement to 73 officers for the period of June the 1st to August the 6th 1976.
