I discussed the compilation of manhour statistics with our (SS) Admin. people as it applies to the Olympics and Sgt. [redacted] advised me as follows:

(1) The present manhour code system covers

- 7840 - Olympic Training
7841 - Olympic Investigations
7842 - Olympic [redacted]
7843 - Olympic [redacted]
7844 - Olympic [redacted]

(2) Any further breakdown will require a submission of a supplement to the present form and would have to be computed manually.

(3) The Manhour Forms submitted by Olympic Secretariat (SS) are not in the computer because the collator code (W0112) is not a Security Service Financial Code. These forms are kept by [redacted] in a drawer in his cabinet. Same applies to the ones from Montreal.

(4) Security Service members who work on the Olympics but submit their Forms under their own Ops. Collator Code will have their Olympic Manhours compiled in the computer under the 784 Codes. These will be easily retrievable after the Games, if and when required.

(5) Whenever previously audited for a specific event, the question of a finite breakdown never came up. The auditors usually were looking for cost and total manpower figures. The information, however, from the Olympics could be of use in planning manpower, and to some extent finances, for any future special events in which the Force may be involved.
