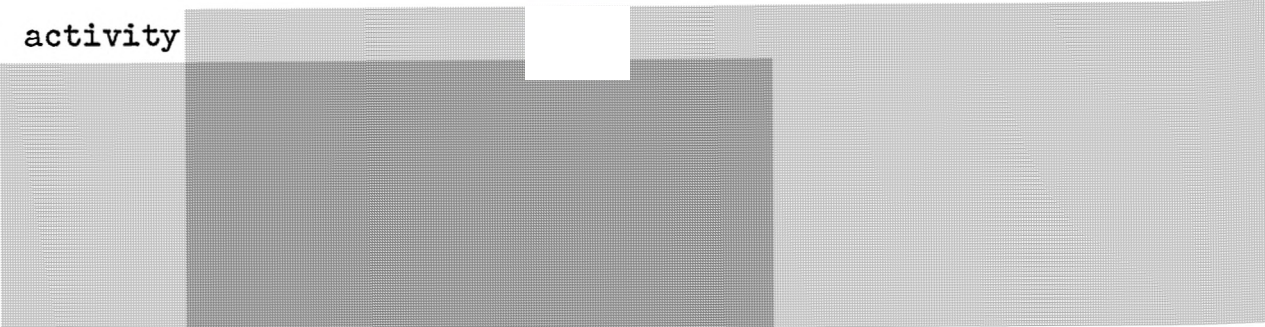
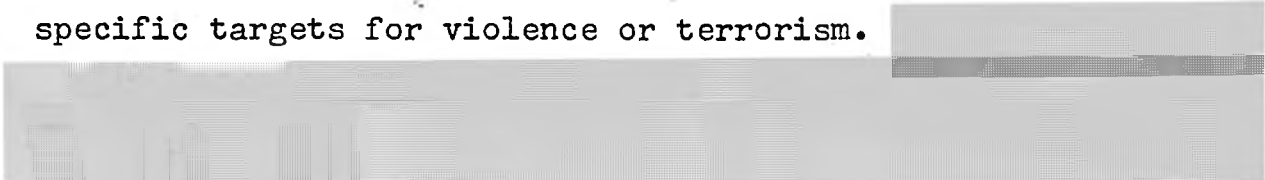


Although membership in the Front de libération du Québec (FLQ) has declined since the 1970 October Crisis, resulting in a dramatic reduction in the level of terrorist activity

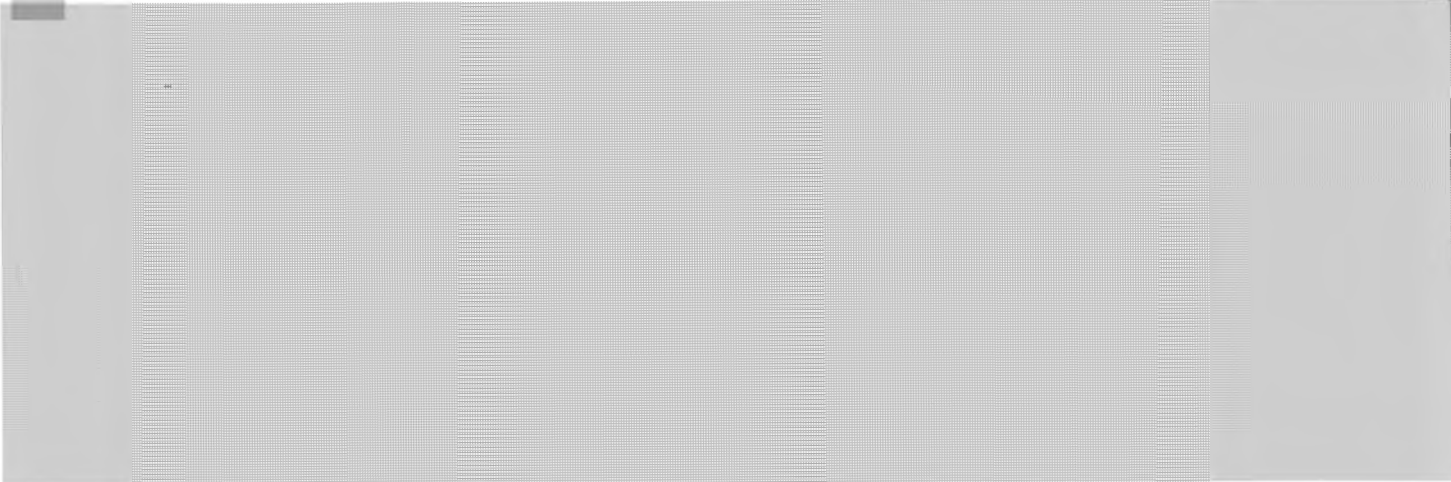


This publication, which calls for the creation of a strong political base as a prerequisite to any armed offensive, fails to designate specific targets for violence or terrorism.



the commitment of several of the members to political terrorism as reflected in past involvement in the FLQ constitutes a potential threat to the 1976 Olympic Games in Montreal.

This international event has precipitated intense criticism among separatist and anti-monarchist groups in Quebec.



Labour unrest in Quebec's construction industry has threatened the completion of Olympic facilities on several occasions during the past year. The most recent walkout, launched by Federation des travailleurs du Québec, to protest government intervention in union affairs was enforced by goon squads which may bespeak a dwindling public sympathy or indeed a crisis of confidence in the organized labour movement. The FTQ and the CSN, who represent most of Quebec's construction workers, are experiencing major internal problems. The FTQ has been preoccupied with a serious loss of membership confidence brought about by the provincially-appointed Cliche Commission enquiry into Quebec trade union affairs which has unearthed evidence of widespread corruption and violence in FTQ's construction unions. The CSN is in the midst of a financial crisis generated by increased administrative costs and the rapid depletion of the strike fund. Although the majority of Quebec workers view their trade union activity as a purely economic function, the continued use of coercive tactics against workers by the unions may generate further industrial strife.

CUBANS

Anti-Castro Cuban exiles have in the past committed acts of sabotage against various Cuban establishments throughout the world. The principal reason for these attacks is the continuing trend in the lessening of tensions between the U.S.A. and the Cuban Government. Because of Canada's friendly trade relations with Cuba, we have been and shall continue to be one of the main focal points for action against Cuban establishments in Canada.

At the present time there are no known Cuban exile organizations operating in Canada.



When viewing organizations of concern to us in connection with the forthcoming Olympics, the Cuban exile organizations should receive prime consideration as a potential source of embarrassment to the Government, as they have demonstrated their capability in committing acts of sabotage, nationally and internationally.

YUGOSLAVS:

CROATIANS: Internationally they are a violent orientated organization that utilizes hi-jacking, murder and bombing to further their nationalism which is based on the revival of the former independant state of Croatia. There are strong international ties with nationally based groups in Canada and they constitute a potential threat as reflected in a current upswing in local events.

SERBIANS: Internationally some factions of the Serbian movement for the revival of the independant state of Serbia utilize terrorist methods and are suspected of having supporters in Toronto. Nationally the Serbians have been maintaining a low profile, but the potential as a source embarassment exists.

The Croatians and Serbians operate independantly and occassionally in violent opposition, but a combined effort is always possible against their mutual foe the Yugoslavs.

JEWISH DEFENSE LEAGUE:


In New York City there is a large violence prone Jewish Defense League - JDL movement which has established a close association with like named organizations in Toronto and Montreal. Activities in Canada are almost non-existent at the present time but close contact, high mobility, and easy access to Canada by New York members requires close scrutiny by security groups.

THE S.D.L., IN ITS SUPPORT FOR ZIONISM IN BOTH THE U.S. AND CANADA, CONTINUES TO VOICE THREATS AGAINST P.L.O. VISITING DELEGATIONS. APPENDIX "A"

THE PALESTINE LIBERATION ORGANIZATION (PLO) was formed in 1964 when the various Arab states agreed on the desirability of creating and supporting a unified Palestinian organization and a conventional Palestine Liberation army. Since 1970, the PLO has been under the leadership and control of Yasser ARAFAT of AL FATAH, and has become known as a political "umbrella" organization for the various terrorist groups.

In October 1974, the leaders of the Arab States designated the PLO as the only legitimate political representative of the Palestinian people. On 22-11-74, the PLO was invited to attend the various function and sessions of the General Assembly and other organs of the United Nations in the capacity of an observer.

The organization is presently attempting to establish a government-in-exile for Palestinians and acquire land from within the Israeli occupied territories of the West Bank of the Jordan River and the Gaza Strip.

AL FATAH is the largest and most important Arab guerrilla organization in the Middle East. Its aim is the destruction of Israel by force and its objective is to return Palestine to Arab rule.

BLACK SEPTEMBER ORGANIZATION - (BSO) was organized from within AL FATAH as a covert terrorist arm and has committed major international terrorist acts. It is believed the BSO has been disbanded as an entity within FATAH and is now in parts an entity adhering to the marxist "Rejection Front".

REJECTION FRONT is a loosely organized political faction comprising mainly of Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine (PFLP), Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) and other Marxist factions who completely reject any type of negotiated settlement between the Palestinians and Israel and are committed to the armed struggle for the liberation of all Palestinian land from Zionist control. The Front is believed to have complete backing from Iraqi in it's endeavours.

THE POPULAR FRONT FOR THE LIBERATION OF PALESTINE (PFLP) is a Marxist-Leninist terrorist organization whose aim is the destruction of Israel as a military, political and economic entity. It has committed major terrorist acts in the name of the Palestinian cause.

THE POPULAR DEMOCRATIC FRONT FOR THE LIBERATION OF PALESTINE (PDFLP) is a splinter group from the PFLP and adheres to a similar ideology. It has committed major terrorist acts in the Middle East.

ARAB LIBERATION FRONT (ALF) is an Iraqi Ba'ath Party controlled terrorist group of small dimensions.

ARAB BA'ATH SOCIALIST PARTY - IRAQ

The Ba'ath Party was founded in Syria in 1941 and is dedicated to Arab unity and Arab socialism and to this end is dedicated to fight against Zionism and Imperialism towards the creation of a unified socialist Arab World. The Ba'ath Party of Iraq (BPI) seized power in Iraq in 1963 and has ruled the nation since that time. The Party is intolerant of any political opposition within the nation and it's policies generally tends to take an aggressive posture towards the country's neighbours.

Public Relations Bureau (PRB)

The PRB was founded in July 1968, and is responsible for kidnapping, assassinations and other terrorist operations. This individual is actively cultivating Canadian/Arab contacts.
