With reference to item 3 on page 4 of our most recent Interdivisional Monthly Meeting minutes dated November 14, 1975, I contacted Sgt. [redacted] of the Immigration and Passport Section of "C" Directorate on the 8 of December, 1975. He advised me that at the present time, there were approximately 12,000 lost or stolen passports included in the NPSIC stolen property file. They anticipated that they would have between 13,000 and 15,000 lost or stolen passports included in the file by the end of December. This would bring the system completely up to date as far as Canadian passports were concerned and they would be updated on a monthly basis with an anticipated change of between 300 and 400 passports every month. These would either be deletions from the system or additions to the system.

2. The Interpol Section of the NPS has taken on the task of placing foreign lost or stolen passports in the same system. They will only be including passports on which they have sufficient information to justify their inclusion. If the information that they are provided through the Interpol services is speculative or not complete, the passport will not be included. It would appear that as a result of this, very few lost or stolen foreign passports will be included.

(1) THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION HAS REFERENCE TO TELEPHONE CONVERSATION BRANDES, [REDACTED] ON 9-7-76.

(2) EARLY LAST WEEK, THE PRESS REPORTED THE THEFT OF 14 TORONTO METROPOLITAN POLICE TUNICS AND THE THEFT OF 28 HIGH-SECURITY ACCREDITATION CARDS FROM KINGSTON. THE FACTS ARE THAT SEVEN HEAVYWEIGHT METRO TUNICS ARE MISSING, PROBABLY IN INVENTORY (IN ANY CASE METRO TUNICS ARE NOT WORN DURING SUMMER); AND THE KINGSTON ACCREDITATION CARDS, WHICH WERE FOR EMPLOYEES, RATHER THAN SECURITY, ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN THROWN OUT IN THE GARBAGE. THE ONLY COMMON DENOMINATOR IS THAT THE NUMBER 28, IS CORRECT.

(3) AS RELATED ABOVE, IT APPEARS AS IF INCIDENT WAS BLOWN OUT OF PROPORTION.
